#### 2<sup>nd</sup> ANNUAL YOUTH INNOVATION FORUM

This three-day experience challenges young people to think beyond today's short-term solutions and become immersed in future-thinking. From science to policy, technological innovations to changing throwaway culture, program content comes directly from Algalita's 20-year history within the movement -- a rare approach that gives youth a "boots on the ground" perspective. Another unique aspect of the Forum is that Algalita provides post-event opportunities for attendees including opportunities to join Algalita's Experienceship Program.

In 2019, 82 students participated in the Forum.









#### 2019 EXPERIENCESHIP PROGRAM

The Experienceship is a hands-on internship designed to give young people an educational journey through plastic pollution. Weekly meetings cover everything from analyzing the solution set and local implications to zero waste culture and our waste management system. Through this program we provide the knowledge, tools, and resources to have a deep understanding of the complexities of plastic pollution.

This year we expanded the program to include industry site visits and field trips.

Over 85 students participated in this program in 2019.





#### 2019 EXPEDITION TO THE NORTH PACIFIC GYRE

During this expedition half of our crew was comprised of members from the Korean Broadcasting System who worked to produce a high-profile plastic pollution documentary to be shared across millions of households.

Once we entered the accumulation zone we met up with Ben Lecompte and his crew from The Vortex Swim. Ben was swimming 300 nautical miles across the North Pacific in order to raise greater awareness of the plastic pollution crisis.

Since this expedition marks the 20th year of Algalita's North Pacific Gyre Monitoring Program, our crew also collected surface water samples and drone data from the center of the accumulation zone to support the work of ocean modelers Nikolai Maximenko and Jan Hafner.

"It was five days without the concentrations letting up. Typically, the plastic comes in waves and gives you a sense that the ocean ecosystem has some relief from the plague, however this time you couldn't watch the ocean and not have visible pieces of plastic floating past the boat for five full days."


